Bronze Award: Complete the compulsory red tasks plus 1 other challenge.

Silver Award: Complete the compulsory red tasks plus 2 other challenges.

Gold Award: Complete the compulsory red tasks plus 3 other challenges.

The focus is QUALITY WORK, not just completing tasks quickly. The final date for submission will be **Friday 1st April**. We are having a half-way check point on **Monday 28th February** to allow you to get feedback on, and support with, your tasks. Please make sure your books are in school for this date. Think carefully about the presentation and content of your work to make sure you give your best to produce work you can be proud of.

Find out five facts about a dinosaur. Create a top trump card to show what you have found out about the dinosaur.

Write a letter to somebody you don't see every day telling them what school is like. Ask them a question about their day too. Remember how we start and finish a letter. Write the address on the envelope and take it to the post box.

Think about the habitats where dinosaurs lived. Use a painting programme on a computer or a tablet to create a picture of a dinosaur habitat. Don't forget to label your picture.

Set up a shop. Play shopkeepers and practise finding the correct coins and making different amounts. Eg. 27p for an apple. If you don't have any money to use, you could make paper money. Send in a photo of you playing shops.

Draw and label a meal for a dinosaur. What would they have as a starter, a main course and a pudding? You will have to decide whether your meal is for a herbivore, carnivore or omnivore.

Choose a book to read that you have never seen before. Pick three words out that you may be unsure of and discover what they mean. Write these words and their meanings down.

Choose one of the seven continents and find five countries that are in that continent. Choose one of the countries and create a poster to show why it is a good place to go on holiday.

Write a Haiku poem about dinosaurs. Haiku poems come from Japan. The first line contains 5 syllables, the second line contains 7 syllables and the third line contains 5 syllable. Can your poem have more than one verse? Perform your poem to your family.

Design and create a dinosaur puppet. This could be a sock puppet, a finger puppet, a wooden spoon puppet, a shadow puppet – the possibilities are endless. Write a list of what you need to make your puppet.
