The Harrogate Hive is located on Bilton Grange Primary School premises & is the perfect place to keep your children safe and entertained before & after school. Meet up with friends, play, socialize & unwind after a busy school day or during holidays. We open during school holidays until 4:30pm, except for bank holidays when the club is closed. Our team are fully DBS checked & hold relevant qualifications in first aid, safeguarding & food hygiene. A small team of experienced play leaders take children to and from their classrooms to ensure they reach club safely. All you need to do is register and book a place using our online booking system IPAL. (Details of how to do this can be found below.)

The club aims to provide parent/carers with flexibility. IPAL will help you to make payments, manage your own account, book sessions last minute, in advance & make any amendments required in one secure place. Through the account you will be able to access & print any invoices.

Each week we have fun event evenings which are organized by staff, these include wet, wild days, talent contests, scooter squad, sports tournaments, reading club, quiz nights, forest school & much more. During the holidays our club gives a relaxed home from home vibe. We have different activities each day and children can choose to participate. Our setting is relaxed; we aim to give children choices and follow their lead as much as possible with regards to the activities each day. A free flow system is in place so your child can choose to play inside or outside during their session. Healthy breakfast options, snacks, and light tea during club are provided to keep hunger at bay until home time.

<u>Please drop us an email once you have booked your first sessions so we can arrange to show you around,</u> <u>introduce you to staff & give you further information on our policies & your child's key person.</u>

Step 1. Visit https://biltongrangeprimary.schoolipal.co.uk

Step 2. Select parent login in the top right-hand corner

Step 3. Complete the new parent registration form and click register, at this point you will receive a confirmation email, please note this email may go into your junk folder, please mark it as safe. Step 4. Once you have completed your registration you will then need to add your child or children **Step 5.** When booking a session select the date/dates you would like, select the session you would like – your children's name will then appear, and you are able to select and complete the booking. **Step 6.** If using a voucher please enter the full voucher amount you are paying not just the cost that the sessions add up to, any funds remaining will then automatically transfer to your wallet once verified. Use the pay by wallet tab to book any further sessions until your wallet is empty again. You will only need to select pay with voucher again when you have a new voucher to use and notify us of.

For any block booking/same sessions each week the system will enable you to manage your payments in monthly.

<u>Attendance</u>

Pupil Absence from school during Term Time

Leave of absence will only be authorised if the appropriate criteria has been met - please see the note below. Following Government Guidelines since September 2013, a Headteacher is not authorised to grant leave of absence during term time in any other circumstances than those stated.

The last academic year saw a significant decline in school attendance at Bilton Grange Primary School. Taking a pupil on leave during term time interrupts teaching and learning and can disrupt educational progress. Please note that NYCC is issuing penalty notices to parents/carers for unauthorised absence.

The school will be closely monitoring all absences and patterns of absence to ensure our attendance figures return to our normal level of 97 to 98% - this will include requesting confirmation of appointments etc. We would be grateful for your support in ensuring your child attends school regularly in line with government regulations.

Medical Appointments

Please ensure where possible that <u>all</u> medical appointments are made outside school hours. We understand that this may not always be achievable but would urge you to ensure that your child has the highest attendance levels as possible.

Holidays in term time

In response to enquiries we have received from some parents about holidays in term time, please read the following information carefully before considering taking your child out of school.

Parents whose children are registered at a school or other educational establishment are responsible for ensuring that they attend punctually and regularly. This applies to all children of compulsory school age. (Children are deemed to be compulsory school age the term following their 5th birthday).

We are obliged to take the attendance register twice a day and record whether children are present or record the reason why a child is not present. This attendance data is then sent to the Department for Education as part of the termly census.

Authorised leave - Valid reasons for absence

There are valid reasons why a child may not be present, for example illness, a medical appointment, a religious festival, music or dance exam or an open day at a secondary school.

Parents should advise school by leaving a message on the telephone answer service or email biltongrange@ycatschools.co.uk before 9.15am on each day of absence to allow the attendance registers to be completed accurately. If the absence is due to a medical appointment then please show your child's class teacher or Mrs Miller in the school office the appointment card

or the text or email appointment notification. Where possible please make routine appointments in the afternoon or school holidays.

Exceptional Circumstances

There are other reasons, classed as 'exceptional,' why a child may not be present. Examples of these exceptional reasons are given to us by the Department for Education and are as follows;

Service personnel returning from active deployment

Where inflexibility of the parents' leave or working arrangement is part of the organisational or company policy. This would need to be evidenced by the production or confirmation from the organisation / company.

Where leave is recommended as part of a parents' or child's rehabilitation from medical or emotional problems. Evidence must be provided.

When a family needs to spend time together to support each other during or after a crisis.

Such leave must be applied for at in advance by completing the forms available in the office. Any leave taken without an application being made in advance is automatically deemed to be unauthorised leave.
